

TUCK RENEWABLE ENERGY FINANCE CHALLENGE

FALL 2022

Competition Rules

1. Application and Team Rules

- 1.1. Teams will apply via an application which will be due (including Resumes) by 9/28/2022 (at 11:59pm EST)
- 1.2. Teams must be comprised of 4-5 members
- 1.3. Team names, logos, and presentation materials (including verbal presentations) may not reference the school that the team is representing
- 1.4. All members must be students (school staff, faculty, and advisors cannot be included) and will register with their university email addresses
- 1.5. At least 3 team members must be MBA students
- 1.6. At least one first-year MBA student must be on the team
- 1.7. After the application is submitted, no new team members may be added
- 1.8. Diversity of the team, including gender, ethnic, and country of origin, will be considered in determining Round 1 eligibility

2. General Case Rules

- 2.1. The case will be released to teams after the application process on 10/2/2022
- 2.2. There will be 3 rounds of the Tuck Renewable Energy Finance Case Competition after the initial application.
- 2.3. No additional information will be provided beyond the case. Please make reasonable assumptions if necessary and cite them in your analysis. Any questions about the case may be sent to Tuck.REFC@tuck.dartmouth.edu. Any questions that can be answered will be emailed to all teams.
- 2.4. External research can be used and must be cited. Teams may not use anyone outside of the team for guidance.

3. Round 1 Rules

- 3.1. Round 1 will be a 2-page maximum memorandum (excluding Appendix and sources) and supporting financial model due on 10/7/2022 by 11:59pm EST via email to Tuck.REFC@tuck.dartmouth.edu. Details will be outlined in the case and submissions will be graded by the Host Team based on a pre-set rubric.
 - 3.1.1. Appendix can contain tables, graphs, figures, charts, or other references
- 3.2. The 6-8 highest scoring teams from Round 1 will be selected for Round 2
 - 3.2.1. The 6-8 finalists will be announced via email by 10/13/2022



4. Round 2 Rules

- 4.1. Round 2 will be a 15-minute PowerPoint presentation, followed by a 10-minute Q&A, administered by industry judges
 - 4.1.1. Round 2 participants must be able to travel to the in-person presentations, which will take place at Tuck's campus in Hanover, NH on 10/21/2022
 - 4.1.2. Teams are requested to send their PowerPoint presentations to Tuck.REFC@tuck.dartmouth.edu by 9am EST on 10/21/2022
 - 4.1.3. The 2 highest scoring teams from Round 2 will be selected for Round 3, which will commence in the afternoon on 10/21/2022

5. Round 3 Rules

- 5.1. Round 3 will be a 15-minute PowerPoint presentation, followed by a 10-minute Q&A, administered by industry judges
 - 5.1.1. The top 2 teams from Round 2 will be provided an additional piece of information and have 2 hours to incorporate it into their final presentation
